



Ozark Christian Academy Dress Code for Girls & Young Ladies

Our Mission is to provide a **distinctively Christian** education that leads students to genuine learning and spiritual formation that will impact the world for Christ. Our dress code reaffirms and validates our Mission to:

- Honor and glorify God as a Christian community (1 Peter 2:9; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
- Respect the distinction of the sexes in a unisex culture (Romans 12:2)
- Exhibit modesty, cleanliness, and neatness with a conservative appearance (Titus 2:12)
- Promote a learning environment void of unnecessary distraction or temptation (Romans 13:14)

Therefore, all students must adhere to the following dress code guidelines while they are on campus and/or all official school activities on/off campus.

Girls and Young Ladies

Standard School Day Dress Code:

Hair: Unquestionably long, to be styled attractively, but not extravagantly, pulled away from the face; must remain natural hair color – no dyeing of the hair.

Face/Body: Clean, free of all cosmetics, including medicated colored cosmetics; no body piercings or jewelry permitted. Watches are permitted.

Shirts: Standard short or long-sleeved polo shirt (buttoned except for top button); solid colors only - may be white, navy or sky blue, red or burgundy, forest or hunter green, gray, or black. It can be textured material or smooth material (avoid thin or athletic material). No brand logos on the outside of shirt. Short sleeve polos need to be closer to the elbow than the top of the arm. No Cap-sleeved polo shirts. See examples in Office.

Skirts: Plain jumpers or skirts (A-line or full) may be worn for all grades (non-stretchy material); solid colors such as khaki (tan), navy, gray, or black may be worn; no splits; No tight, form fitting, or pencil style skirts. Length must be two inches below the bottom of the knee, preferably mid-calf (even when wearing leggings under skirt). Leggings should be neutral; solid colors, and as close to skirt color as possible.

Shoes/Socks: Casual, solid, shoes. Athletic recommended for K-6th, casual/dressy recommended for 7-12th. Solid colors include black, white, gray, navy, tans, & brown. No boots except for casual days are to be worn. Plain socks to be worn or hosiery with no sheer designs.

Sweaters: Matching, conservative-color cardigan, fleece, pullover, or vest, may be worn; White, Navy, Tan, Black, Gray, Brown etc. No pull-over hoodies or hats are to be worn in class.

Jackets: Jackets are not to be worn in class. They can be distracting from student productivity. If students tend to be cold, please consider having one of the options above.

Physical Education Class:

Shirts: School approved shirt. No questionable/inappropriate references (all clothing is subject to the Administration). Wear appropriate undergarment such as tank top, undershirt, etc.

Skirts: A-line or full athletic style or denim skirt with no excessive rips, tears, or holes; no splits; No tight, form fitting, or pencil style skirts. Length must be two inches below the bottom of the knee, preferably mid-calf (even when wearing leggings under skirt.)

Shoes/Socks: Athletic shoes and appropriate socks.

Be conscientious of athletic activities

Casual Day Friday & Special Occasions:

Clothing: Same as physical education class or business casual attire. Hoodies permitted on cold days but not hats.

Shoes/Socks: Any appropriate shoes or boots (no sandals, open toe or excessive heel) that the student can walk in well and does not draw unnecessary attention.

Boys and Young Gentlemen

Standard School Day Dress Code

Hair: Conservative style hair cut with sideburns not lower than the middle of the ear; must remain natural hair color – no dyeing of the hair.

Face/Body: Clean, no facial hair permitted; no body piercings or jewelry permitted. Watches are permitted.

Shirts: Standard short or long-sleeved polo shirt (buttoned except for top button); solid colors only - may be white, navy or sky blue, red or burgundy, forest or hunter green, gray, or black. Polos can be textured material or smooth material (avoid thin or athletic material). No brand logos on the outside of shirt. Short sleeve polos need to be closer to the elbow than the top of the arm. No Cap-sleeved polo shirts. See examples in Office.

Pants/Belts: Plain dress pants may be worn for all grades; solid colors such as khaki (tan), navy, gray, or black may be worn with solid black or brown dress belt. Belts required if student consistently cannot keep their pants to stay in place.

Shoes/Socks: Casual, solid, shoes. Athletic recommended for K-6th, casual/dressy recommended for 7-12th. Solid colors include black, white, gray, navy, & tans. No boots except for casual days. Plain socks to be worn with no sheer designs.

Sweaters: Matching, conservative-color cardigan, fleece, pullover, or vest, may be worn; White, Navy, Tan, Black, Gray, Brown etc. No pull-over hoodies or hats are to be worn in class.

Jackets: Jackets are not to be worn in class. They can be distracting from student productivity. If students tend to be cold, please consider having one of the options above.

Physical Education Class:

Shirts: School approved shirt. No questionable/inappropriate references (all clothing is subject to the Administration). Wear appropriate undergarment such as tank top, undershirt, etc.

Pants: Athletic style or denim jeans with no excessive rips, tears, or holes. Pants must fit properly, not too short or too tight; no sweatpants.

Shoes/Socks: Athletic shoes and appropriate socks.

Be conscientious of athletic activities

Casual Days Friday & Special Occasions:

Clothing: Same as Physical Education class or business casual attire. Hoodies are permitted for cooler weather but not hats.

Shoes/Socks: Any appropriate shoes or boots (no sandals) that the student can walk in well and does not draw unnecessary attention.
